Subject: English Language

Curriculum Aims

The English Language curriculum at the senior secondary level aims to enable learners to:

- broaden and deepen the language competencies they have developed through basic education (P1 - S3), so that they are able to use English with increasing proficiency for personal and intellectual development,

effective social interaction, further study, vocational training, work and pleasure;

- further develop their interest and confidence in using English as their understanding and mastery of the language grow;
- further broaden their knowledge, understanding and experience of various cultures in which English is used; and
- further develop "learning how to learn" skills and positive values and attitudes conducive to meeting the needs of our rapidly changing knowledge-based society. These include the interpretation, use and production of texts for pleasure, study and work in the English medium.
