

Expanding Horizons and June 2024 Fostering Knowledge through READING

The Reading Culture Team has organized a variety of learning activities such as book exhibitions, online reading activities, excursions, pictorial exhibitions, Book Review Competition, Video-making Competition and Oral Presentation Competition to foster a love for reading.

A variety of book exhibitions were organized in collaboration with different subject departments throughout the year. Those exhibitions, such as *Science in Everyday Life* and *Hong Kong's Resistance against Japanese Aggression*, allowed students to delve into different academic disciplines and expand their knowledge base. By exploring a diverse range of books, students have deepened their understanding of various subjects and developed a multidisciplinary approach to learning.

To further enhance students' personal growth and character development, the Reading Culture Team prepared different reading materials centered around important themes such as 'Self-confidence' and 'Act with Integrity'. These aimed at boosting students' self-confidence and instilling core values that would guide students throughout their lives.

Also, online reading activities were organized in collaboration with Science, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, STEM and English Departments, encouraging all students to read extensively and explore resources related to their academic subjects. Being engaged in those activities, students embraced the joy of independent learning with their knowledge being expanded and their critical thinking skills being strengthened. One of the highlights of the Reading Culture Team's initiatives is organizing enriching excursions to places such as the Hong Kong Science Museum and the Hong Kong Museum of Coastal Defence. These excursions provided students with invaluable learning experiences beyond the confines of the classroom. Students had the opportunity to explore the wonders of science, witness the changes of Hong Kong's coastal defense throughout history, and learn about our country's resistance against Japanese aggression.

Moreover, a 'Reading Across the Curriculum' book exhibition was co-organised with the Chinese History and History Departments after the excursion. Each S1 student borrowed one book and set two related questions for their classmates. Through this activity, students not only expanded their knowledge but were also engaged in meaningful discussions with their peers. This collaborative approach to learning allowed students to gain new insights and perspectives while fostering a sense of camaraderie within their class.

For students across all levels, there was also a fascinating Pictorial Exhibition on *China's War of Resistance Against Japanese Aggression*, providing students with a visual representation of the historical events and sacrifices made during this crucial period. Having been immersed in the images and stories displayed, students gained a deeper appreciation of the courage and resilience of those who fought for our home country.

The experience was further enriched by presenting what they had learnt in the semi-final, which was held on 27th April at Science Park. Nurturing Future Leaders: 2D1N Senior Prefect Leadership Training Gamp

In a world that demands strong leadership, our school recognizes the importance of equipping our senior prefects with the necessary skills and qualities to become the future leaders of our community. To that end, we organized a 2-day-1-night leadership training camp at the HKAYP Jockey Club Duke of Edinburgh Training Camp. This immersive experience aimed to empower our senior prefects, fostering their potential and preparing them to lead with integrity, empathy, and vision.

The camp commenced with an atmosphere of excitement and anticipation as our senior prefects embarked on a team building activity in the Adventure Park. Senior prefects had to complete the climbing route in teams of four. It required participants to communicate with

The Giant Ladders Challenge presented our prefects with a unique opportunity to test their physical and mental capabilities. They had to ascend new heights in pairs under the guidance of experienced instructors. With each step up the rungs, our students embraced the challenge, pushing themselves beyond their comfort zones. Botticelli to Van Gogh: Masterpieces from The National Gallery, London

In early April, 42 S4 and S5 students attended the exhibition, *Botticelli* to Van Gogh: Masterpieces from The National Gallery, London, the first showcase of the Gallery's prestigious painting collection in Hong Kong. The exhibition at the Hong Kong Palace Museum was divided into six sections, covering themes such as mythology, daily life, and landscapes from different periods and art styles, including the Renaissance, Impressionism and Post-Impressionism. It features 52 of the world's finest masterpieces, dating to the 15th to early 20th century, painted by fifty influential artists, including Botticelli, Raphael, Titian, Caravaggio, Rembrandt, Goya, Turner, Constable, Monet, and Van Gogh, spanning more than 400 years of Western art history.

珠海航空科技考察

公民與社會發展科在教育局和 華暢東方文化國際交流有限公司的 協調下,於2024年3月25至26日, 展開了兩日一夜的珠海航空科技考 察。這次考察對於14位老師和131 名中五學生來説,是一個認識我國 科技先進發展的啟蒙之旅。

當日早上,一行人從學校出 發,乘坐旅遊車穿越港珠澳大橋, 順利抵達珠海。師生首先參觀了愛 飛客航空科普基地,了解到我國在 航天領域取得的巨大成就;也透過 解説,深入認識到我國在航空科技 方面的領先地位。









隨後,考察團前往天威集團的3D打印創新中心。這個中心展示了先進的3D打印技 術在航空航天、生物醫學和高端製造等產業領域的應用。師生驚嘆於3D打印技術的革 命性影響,並透過親身參與3D打印活動,深入了解到這一項技術對於我國產業升級轉 型和創新發展的重要性。

第二天,考察團參觀了全國最大的太空科普園地——珠海太空中心。珠海太空中心 設有多個展區,包括空間站核心區、航天展區、航空展區、國防展區、無人裝備展區、 元宇宙展區,以及專題展區等。館內有一個以1:1比例還原的「天宮」太空站展示艙, 為全國獨有。師生進入內部參觀太空人員的工作區、生活區、睡眠區、出艙口等,體驗 他們的工作及生活環境。師生們亦參觀了太空模擬實驗室、火箭發射控制中心等,藉着 館內多元化的互動體驗,特別是豐富的VR體驗,深刻感受到國家在航天科技方面的雄 厚實力,並了解到我國在航天探索和應用層面所取得的重要突破。

下午,考察團參觀最後一個景點——珠海大劇院和海韻城,這兩個地方展示了國家 文化旅遊產業的豐富發展機遇,師生對我國在文化藝術領域的發展潛力和多元性有了更 深刻的體會。

為配合這次考察,學生須事前進行資料搜集,在考察期間和活動結束後分別完成一 手資料紀錄工作紙和考察之旅知識整合的小組習作。他們亦須在本學年完結前,提交是 次考察之旅見聞的研究報告。這次珠海考察之旅,讓學生對我國的先進發展有了確切的 認識,提升他們對國家的歸屬感和國民身份認同感。學生深刻體會到,自己作為中華民 族的一份子,有責任了解自身的長處和志向,並多加關注祖國的最新發展路向,好讓自 己在日後的生涯規劃中,更適切地為祖國的發展作貢獻。

全方位學習日

中一級

全方位學習日是一個極具教 育價值的活動。對於中一學生而 言,參觀沙田污水處理廠、馬鞍 山濾水廠及元朗排水繞道是一個 難得的學習機會。這些地方代表 了現代城市的基礎建設。學生透 過了解廠房的運作原理,增強了 環保意識和科學知識。在沙田污



水處理廠,學生可以學習到如何將污水轉化為可再利用的水 資源。而在馬鞍山濾水廠,他們可以了解到飲用水的處理過 程,以及如何確保水質安全。最後,參觀元朗排水繞道可以 讓學生了解城市排水系統的運作,並學習到如何解決城市排 水問題。這些實地參觀成為學生寶貴的經驗,加深他們對環 境保護和城市基礎建設的認識。學生回校後,根據課堂學習 到的科學知識,分組匯報各項設施的原理,把書本上的知識 應用於日常生活中。



中三級

全方位學習日為中三學 生帶來了一個難得的機會, 他們可以到M+博物館欣賞 宋懷桂女士的作品。宋懷桂 女士(1937-2006)是80至90 年代中國精英文化圈中的

傳奇人物。她既是新中國第一位擁有跨國婚姻的女性,也是 中國藝術的先鋒,後來更成為了將法國時尚帶入中國的頭號 標誌式人物。冷戰時代的中國幾近與世隔絕,宋懷桂女士與 丈夫、來自保加利亞的壁掛藝術家萬曼(1932-1989)一起, 擔當聯繫東西方的橋樑,為中國引入與國際接軌的現代生活 方式。她是一位傑出的藝術家,其作品以獨特的風格和深厚 的文化內涵而聞名。在博物館,學生可以近距離欣賞她的畫 作、雕塑等藝術品,並對她的創作思想和風格有更深入的了 解。回到學校後,學生可以根據自己的體驗設計一本展覽場 刊,用以介紹宋懷桂女士的作品和生平。此外,學生還可以



分組進行展覽介紹,每 個小組負責研究一件作 品,並在班級內互相分 享。這不僅可以提升學 生的藝術欣賞能力,還 能培養他們的合作和表 達能力。 中二級

全方位學習日 為中二學生提供了 一個難得的戶外學 習機會,他們到香 港仔體驗漁村文



化。這個活動不僅能讓學生認識到香港的文化遺產,還可以 加深對漁業和海洋生態的了解。在漁村,學生可以近距離觀 察漁民的生活和工作,明白他們的辛勤付出和面臨的困難。 回到學校後,學生可以根據自己的體驗撰寫一篇描寫文,描 述他們在漁村的所見所聞,包括漁民的生活方式、傳統漁業



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技術以及人與大自然的關 係等。這樣的延伸練習不 僅提升學生的寫作能力, 還培養他們對本土文化的 認識和欣賞能力。

中四級
